



School Studio Intern Artist

Artists Working in Education, Inc. seeks Intern Artists for its School Studio art residency program for the fall and spring semesters. A.W.E. offers Milwaukee children opportunities for creative expression and discovery by sponsoring artists to collaborate with them on art projects of excellence and significance. School Studio projects are 40-hour visual art residencies that take place in Milwaukee schools during the fall or spring semester with students in kindergarten through 12th grades.

Projects explore a single media (i.e. painting, fiber arts, sculpture, ceramics, etc.) and take place during the school day, generally between the hours of 8 a.m. and 3 p.m., according to a schedule determined by the school and artists. The Intern will collaborate with a Lead Artist, A.W.E. staff and school staff to plan, prepare, implement, evaluate and celebrate the project.

Interns receive stipends and are asked to attend an orientation session. A.W.E. offers networking and professional development opportunities for artists throughout the year.

Desired qualifications include:

- Strong academic art background, preferably a degree in fine art, art education or art therapy; or significant professional art experience.
- Working artist with exhibit history.
- Previous experience working with school age children in the arts.
- Desire to continue career as a professional teaching artist
- Professional demeanor and approach
- Maturity to take on leadership role when necessary
- Flexible and open schedule to accommodate the schedule requested by the school
- Transportation to project sites throughout the City of Milwaukee
